OPENING

Hello, slots enthusiasts! How are you? My name is Jon Friedl. Welcome to Professor Slots, a channel devoted to mastering casino slots so you can win your way to success!

Today we're going to be diving into slots predictions for 2021 based on important events in the slots gaming industry from 2020.

It's great to see you all here again for another Professor Slots podcast episode and live stream. If you're with us live, be sure to say hello and ask your slots-related questions and share your own slots predictions for 2021! I'll get to those a little later in the show.

I started these weekly live streams over a year ago, around Thanksgiving in 2019, and hadn't missed a weekend for nearly 13 months. But then I made a last-minute decision to cancel the last two live streams including on December 26th, the day after Christmas Day, and January 2nd, the day after New Year's Day.

Both were just too soon after such major holidays. My apologies for the short notice when cancelling both. Looking forward for 2021, which is what today's show is all about, major holidays are Easter Sunday on April 4th, although we should be okay to have a live stream on Saturday that weekend. Saturday, May 1st is Kentucky Derby and the Preakness Stakes is two weeks later. I suppose it's okay to hold a live stream that those days, especially Derby Day given it's such a significance event for slots enthusiasts. And finally, Christmas Day and New Year's Day fall directly on Saturdays, so I likely won't be holding a live stream on those two major holidays. What all that means is, it should be nearly a year of Saturdays before I take off another live stream.

So, hey, Happy New Year 2021! Congratulations! We made it! Wow, what a year 2020 was!

INTRODUCTION TO CASINO CHANGES IN 2021

A lot happened with casinos this past year! The U.S. slots industry is constantly changing, updating, adding new game themes, taking old ones away, tweaking algorithms, not to mention all the trends created! Today I'll summarize the biggest casino changes that happened last year and how they will impact strategies this year.

2020 – WHAT A YEAR INCLUDING WITH SLOTS!

There's a lot more changes coming in 2021 than most years. Why? Because of 2020.

Last year saw every U.S. casino close when previously, way back in 1963, only the Las Vegas casinos closed a day for the funeral of President Kennedy.

The changes we'll be seeing in 2021 are due to why U.S. casinos closed for a month or more. Yes, because of the tragic and so deadly pandemic of 2020.

As you know well, all casinos closed in 2020. And then, when they came back, they did not return at full capacity. Plexiglas was everywhere. Every other machine (or more!) turned off or disabled. And, of course, temperature testing and the wearing of masks became commonplace.

Perhaps you even brought your own cleaning materials to the casino so you could sanitize slot machine before playing them. I know some of you have done this. And good for you!

But what else happened in 2020? True, slots players got a break from slots. Of course, online slots enthusiasts who already preferred playing online saw little disruption in their play.

But many casino slots enthusiasts learned that online slots weren't a worthy alternative to brick-and-mortar casino slots. When was the building of anticipation during the drive to our favorite casino? What about meeting up with old friends? Where was the wonderful, comped meal? Where were the envious glances from or to strangers when winning?

Nowhere online.

But something else happened in 2020. What? Slot machine manufacturers got a break from pushing new content to closed casinos. They caught up. And they got a chance to innovate.

Most game developers for slot manufacturers already worked from home before the pandemic. That's where they program and develop new games. But not just new games, because these slots companies do a whole lot more than manufacture slot machines, make games, and develop casino operating systems with their central computer servers and algorithms.

But there's more going on than that. A lot more. And 2020 gave them the opportunity to develop these new products and release them in 2021. Let's talk about these new products we're already seeing at a few of the most modern casinos ... and likely also see become widespread in 2021.

And, of course, let's see if we can use them to win at slots.

1. CASINOS WILL MAKE A BIG COMEBACK IN 2021

Yes, every U.S. casino closed in 2020. If you watched my live streams on my YouTube Channel on Saturdays at Noon ET over last spring, we watched it happen together over many weeks including the fast closings, what it all meant, the much slower re-openings, and what the new restrictions meant.

We now know that, of the nearly 1,000 casinos in the U.S., almost a hundred of them have remained closed. Which casinos are still closed can be seen using the American Gaming Association's Casino Tracker.

I suspect these casino facilities will remain closed. It's a simple engineering facility planning principle that buildings without an active HVAC system through a summer, fall, and winter typically makes large buildings unfit for humans.

But open casinos are making enough to remain open. They're making a go of it in the hopes of getting back to being big moneymakers for commercial investors and tribal communities.

And it looks like that's going to happen in 2021. Based on a decision to be cautious when the pandemic broke out, many slots enthusiasts simply stopped going to casinos.

Perhaps some have given up on play slots. Being a slots enthusiast myself who has limited my exposure to the virus at fully open casinos in Ohio, I sincerely believe that's temporary. Once they feel it's safe, I think slots enthusiasts will come rushing back to their hobby of playing slots.

The question is, when will it be safe to go back to casinos? Whether it be spring, summer, or early fall, it looks like the vaccine could be administered to everyone who wants it by fall 2021.

My prediction is that casinos will become flooded with slots enthusiasts by the end of 2021, perhaps more than ever seen before by a wide margin. And won't it be something to see the consequences of that happening.

INTERLUDE

Let's check in with the Live Chat to briefly say hello...

That was excellent!

During this interlude, before getting back to today's topic, I wanted to mention that 2020 was a great year for my Professor Slots business. For those of you that are new to my live stream on YouTube, I also have a substantial website, podcast, a 200+ page book called Learning to Win, paid consultations, and more. Just Google Professor Slots to find my website and podcast.

I've been on YouTube for years. In fact, in 10 days is my 3-year anniversary on YouTube. And, yes, I've been hosting weekly live streams for over a year. But for most of that three years, my YouTube channel was basically unused or used wrong. It took me nearly two years to get 100 subscribers and the required watch time of 4,000 hours over six months to be able to host a live stream.

But all that changed in early 2020 when I started posting educational slots videos that mattered to viewers, some of which mattered a lot. YouTube noticed this with their algorithm and started to put my videos in front of others YouTube thought might be interested in my content. Many others. To give you an idea of how much has changed, in the last month alone I've gotten over 2,700 new subscribers and nearly 20,000 hours of watch time.

I'm mentioning all this because I was laid off over last summer and am basically living off of my savings while committing myself to making a living with my Professor Slots business. After all, those student loans I got for earning eight college degrees, mostly in physics and engineering, despite working my way through college for 25 years, aren't going to pay themselves.

Despite getting a small income from YouTube's monetization program, I'm not successful yet. As is usual with me, I expect to pay as I go. But I would be remiss if I didn't offer you a way to give back. At this time, I'll run out of savings in the fall of 2021. If I can't make this business successful by then, well... I'd love to keep generating great educational slots content and be a resource to you with already available paid consultations as well as online courses (currently in development), but that'll be extremely difficult to continue if I can't support myself.

Since you're here now, and especially if I've already helped you make a profit a slot machine casino gambling, I'm asking you now to give me a tip using the dollar-sign icon at the bottom of the live chat window.

Here's how that works on a desktop computer. It's different but similar on a smart phone or tablet. Simply click on the dollar sign icon and select the Super Chat option. The Super Sticker option also works, but it's not as easy to use. Under the Super Chat option, you'll next see a showing a sliding scale for choosing a dollar amount. 2. NEW WAYS TO PLAY SLOTS IN 2021

Every year, gaming companies like IGT, Scientific Games, and many more create new game themes. Not only do they create new games themes, perhaps based on your favorite movie or television show, but they also innovate how to play the game.

No place was this more evident in 2020 than with penny slot machines. Lightning Link, anyone? That only became popular in 2019, right?

I've played them of course, along with other penny slot machines where are essentially disguised high-limit slot machines (\$8.80 bets!) almost guaranteed to have the worst odds anywhere in the U.S. based on state-provided return statistics.

But that's okay. Because there are so many of them in most casinos, we take the opportunity to look for and find those which are winners. That's what my winning slots strategies are all about.

But the latest penny slot machines don't even seem to have a pay table. As slot machines, they must – but pay tables have become so complicated they're many pages on touchscreens. That's what happens when you might bet nearly a thousand credits with half a dozen different bonus games.

But this is the direction in which slot machine games are moving. It's something we'll see more of in 2021. Why? Because it's been so successful for both casinos and the gaming companies that develop and supply these slot machines.

Those casinos not yet made up of slot machines with one big, curved touchscreen will start seeing more of them. Many more. Like, all of them. It's already happening at some casinos.

But let's take this a step further. Yes, in 2021 many more casinos will get or get more penny slot machines with one huge screen. But let's think like a casino or gaming company executive. What's the plan?

Do you see it? It's just like winning at slots. Figure out what works, which they have, and grow from there. Why wouldn't they replace every slot machine with machines with one big screen and complicated, multi-bonus, long paytable game themes?

And, these executives are thinking, why limit ourselves to penny slots? Of course, electrical power availability and a casino's willingness to invest so much, even on a proven product, is a risk. Casino executives will have to carefully think it over, yet the business case seems clear.

And that's where I predict slot machine game themes will trend in 2021 and beyond.

3. CASINO WEBSITE APPS AS A TOOL TO WIN

Have you been to the website of your favorite casino lately? You really should visit, especially in 2021. There may well be something very useful for you there, especially in terms of winning slots strategies.

The World's Oldest Winning Slots Strategy Still in Play (Live Q&A) is all about location, location, location. Yes, I stole (ahem!) BORROWED that saying from the real estate industry.

Casinos would very much like to get something back for giving you a jackpot. Well, they hide exits so you stay and play. That just a typical casino design.

But what about other slots enthusiasts also helping pay back the casino? That's easy enough. The casino simply improves the odds of winning on slot machines visible from a distance.

If you've been carefully listening to my podcast or watching videos on my YouTube Channel, you likely already know this strategy. When you find a candidate slot machine, stand in front of it with your back to the machine. Look where it looks. What do you see?

If you see a wall right in front of you, seriously consider finding another slot machine because few can see you win. But instead, maybe you'll see other slots players looking back at you. Or casino goers coming toward you on a busy walkway on their way to lunch or dinner. Then by all means, stay at that candidate slot machine!

The trouble with this strategy is, where are all the best locations in the casino. To find them all, and maybe ask my option during a consultation, you'd need a map. As I know from some of your prior consultations, sketches of the casino's floorplan are less than ideal.

In 2021, there's an easy solution becoming available for getting a casino's floor map. Some casinos already have it. To see what I mean, visit the website of Oklahoma's WinStar Casino, the world's largest casino.

It's right there. Look for the little icon that looks like a slightly folded map. If you're looking at their website from a desktop computer, it's a red icon with white letters at left of what is currently a truly horrible banner. On a smart phone or tablet, it's little white icon in the upper right corner of the website.

Not only is this a casino map but it's even more than that. It's interactive. Meaning, while at the casino you can locate yourself within the map, select a new location within this, the world's largest casino, and it'll give you a route to take to get to that new location. This works great with their "Game Finder" tool.

Isn't that innovative? Now slots enthusiasts at WinStar have a complete casino floorplan. They can go online prior to the trip and start scouting which slot machines have the best location, location, location. All from the comfort of their home.

I've been to the website of every casino in the U.S. as part of my online resource of weekly state-by-state slots articles, now in its fourth year. Few yet have this innovative and helpful tool.

In 2021, my prediction is that you'll also get access to the floor plan at your favorite casino. And that's going to be a winning slots advantage!

SUMMARY OF CASINO CHANGES IN 2021

The U.S. slots industry is constantly changing, perhaps no more than it will in 2021 since the last big change when riverboat casinos started opening in 1989 and expanded casinos from just being in Nevada and Atlantic City to across the U.S.

District of Columbia slot machine casino gambling does not exist. The U.S.'s sole federal district is the capital of the United States of America. It has no casinos but does have a well-respected lottery.

Relevant Legal Statutes on Gambling in the District of Columbia

The minimum legal gambling age in the District of Columbia depends upon the gambling activity:

- Land-Based Casinos: Not available
- Poker Rooms: Not available
- Bingo: 18
- Lottery: 18
- Pari-Mutuel Wagering: Not available

Purchasers of lottery tickets must be 18 years of age or older. However, a person under 18 may receive a lottery ticket as a gift and paid a lottery prize.

Slot Machine Private Ownership in the District of Columbia

Next up is a usually short statement about slot machine private ownership, which I have included in case you live in the U.S. federal district and are considering owning a slot machine. Here it is:

In the District of Columbia, it is legal to privately own a slot machine if manufactured before 1952.

Gaming Control Board in the District of Columbia

The District of Columbia's gaming control commission is the Office of Lottery and Gaming (OLG).

Legalized in 1982, the DC Lottery pays out more than 50% of annual sales in prize money, totaling \$3.8 billion since it began.

The Sports Wagering Lottery Amendment Act of 2018 legalized sports wagering in the District of Columbia on May 3, 2019.

Casinos in the District of Columbia

In this section, I'll discuss District of Columbia gambling establishments.

No casinos exist in the District of Columbia.

Non-Tribal Casinos in the District of Columbia

No commercial casinos with slot machines exist in the District of Columbia.

American Indian Casinos in the District of Columbia

The District of Columbia has no federally recognized American Indian tribes and, therefore, no tribal casinos.

Other Gambling Establishments

As an alternative to enjoying District of Columbia slot machine casino gambling, consider exploring casino options in a nearby state. Bordering the District of Columbia is:

- Northeast, Northwest, and Southeast: Maryland
- Southwest: Virginia

Payout Returns in the District of Columbia

As no casinos exist in the District of Columbia, neither do theoretical payout limits nor return statistics for slot machines.

Summary of District of Columbia Slots in 2020

In summary, District of Columbia slot machine casino gambling does not exist in the nation's capital of Washington, DC. However, as of 2019, legal sports betting has arrived.

Relatively nearby casinos exist in the neighboring state of Maryland. Another nearby state, Virginia, will soon have casinos to offer as well.

Annual Progress in District of Columbia Slot Machine Casino Gambling

In the last year, there has been little change to the slots gaming industry in DC.

As usual whenever a state or territory suffers a significant event, manmade or otherwise, my heartfelt sympathy and concern goes out to the District of Columbia over the tragic loss of life this last week at our nation's Capital.

Florida slot machine casino gambling consists of eight pari-mutuel racetracks in Broward and Miami-Dade Counties, seven tribal casinos, senior center amusement arcades, multi-day cruise ships with onboard casinos, and day-long gambling boats.

Relevant Legal Statutes on Gambling in Florida

The minimum legal gambling age in Florida depends upon the gambling activity:

- Land-Based Casinos: 21
- Poker Rooms: 18
- Bingo: 18
- Lottery: 18
- Pari-Mutuel Wagering: 18

State gaming regulations have authorized slot machines at pari-mutuel wagering racetracks in Broward and Miami-Dade Counties. These counties contain the cities of Miami and Fort Lauderdale in southern Florida.

Coin-operated amusement machines at senior center arcades are not slot machines and fall into the same category as pinball machines, shooting galleries, music machines, and video games.

Slot Machine Private Ownership in Florida

Next up is a usually short statement about slot machine private ownership, which I have included in case you live in this U.S. state and are considering owning a slot machine. Here it is:

In Florida, it is legal to own a slot machine privately if it is at least 20 years old.

Gaming Control Board in Florida

The gaming control commission is the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering within Florida's Department of Business & Professional Regulation (DBPR).

Overall, the DBPR authorizes, regulates or provides oversight for Florida's gaming industries of:

- Pari-mutuel wagering at racetracks
- Cardroom games
- Florida tribal gaming

There are over three dozen pari-mutuel wagering facilities in Florida for which the DBPR is responsible, including the eight sites with slot machines. The DBPR does not regulate bingo, the Florida Lottery, coin-operated amusement machines, or day-long casino boats.

Historically, Florida has a long history of gambling, starting 100 years before gaming became legal. For example, at his first hotel, the Ponce de Leon in St. Augustine in 1888, Henry Flagler created the exclusive and famous Bacchus Club Casino.

Tribal gaming originally arrived in Florida with the federal Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (IGRA) of 1988. With it, Florida's two federally recognized American Indian tribes opened casinos offering Class II bingo-style gaming.

Eventually, the Seminole Tribe of Florida has negotiated a tribal-state compact allowing them to offer Class III Vegas-style gaming at their seven casinos.

However, the Miccosukee Tribe of Indians of Florida has not completed their gaming compact negotiations, limiting them to Class II bingo-style gaming machines at their single casino.

Casinos in Florida

In this section, I'll discuss Florida gambling establishments.

There are eight pari-mutuel racetracks with slot machines, seven American Indian tribal casinos, and two daily casino cruise ships based in Florida.

The largest casino in Florida is Seminole Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Tampa with 5,000 gaming machines.

The second-largest casino is Seminole Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Hollywood with 3,100 gaming machines.

Non-Tribal Casinos in Florida

The Eight pari-mutuel racetrack and wagering sites in Broward and Miami-Dade Counties hosting Miami and Fort Lauderdale offer slot machines.

American Indian Casinos in Florida

There are also seven tribal casinos in southern Florida with slot machines.

As usual when there are too many casinos to mention here, a complete list, along with a casino map, are on my webpage for this state at professorslots.com/FL.

Other Gambling Establishments

As an alternative to enjoying Florida slot machine casino gambling, consider exploring casino options in a nearby state. Bordering Florida is:

- North: Georgia
- North and West: Alabama
- Southeast: Puerto Rico and U.S. Virgin Islands

Besides multi-day cruise ships with onboard casinos sailing to international destinations, there are two day-long casino cruise boats with onboard Vegas-style gaming available in Florida:

- Tropical Breeze Casino in Port Richey, 37 miles northwest of Tampa.
- Victory Casino Cruises in Port Canaveral, 60 miles southeast of Orlando.

Payout Returns in Florida

Florida's pari-mutuel wagering sites with slot machines in Broward and Miami-Dade Counties have a minimum theoretical payout of 85%. Return statistics by month and tribal casino are publicly available by dividing Credits Out by Credits In and multiplying by 100%.

For October 2020, the monthly player win percentages were:

- The Big Easy: 91.9%

- Calder Casino: 91.1%
- Casino Miami: 92.7%
- The Casino @ Dania Beach: 92.2%
- Gulfstream Park: 91.6%
- Hialeah Park: 94.0%
- Isle Casino Pompano: 90.3%
- Magic City: 93.4%
- All: 92.4%

For October 2020, the highest return, again, went to Hialeah Park, with 94.0%, again closely followed by Magic City at 93.4%. The lowest return, also again, went to Isle Casino at 90.3%.

Florida's tribal compacts do not require theoretical payout limits on their slot machines, nor do they required to make return statistics publicly available.

Summary of Florida Slots in 2020

In summary, Florida slot machine casino gambling consists of eight pari-mutuel racetracks in Broward and Miami-Dade Counties hosting Miami and Fort Lauderdale, seven tribal casinos in southern Florida, senior center arcades with amusement machines, multi-day cruise ships with onboard casinos to international destinations, and several day-long gambling boats which sail to international waters before gambling can commence.

Annual Progress in Florida Slot Machine Casino Gambling

In the last year, Seminole Casino Immokalee has slipped from second largest casino in Florida all the way to sixth place. Why? Because it did not increase in slot machines as had four other once smaller casinos.
